# Guidance for members playing outdoor bowls

### **Duties and expectations**

All players have a responsibility to maintain the highest standards and to contribute to make the game enjoyable for themselves and others.

#### You should:

- Be punctual for games
- Understand the role and responsibilities of each team member in the game
- Recognise good play by teammates and opponents
- Set a positive example for young participants and spectators
- Abide by the accepted etiquette of the sport
- Remember, whether playing at home or away, that you are an ambassador for your club.

#### **Dress code**

Winslow Bowls club expects that all players respect the dress code:

- For all matches, both at home or away, <u>players must wear the approved team kit</u>. This includes friendly games, league games, internal competitions and any special events that the club may organise.
- The approved kit consists of Club shirts and (for men) navy blue trousers or shorts; (for ladies) navy blue full- or three-quarter-length trousers, shorts or skirts. Trousers, shorts and skirts <u>may not be</u> of denim or cargo style. A plain white jumper and/or white waterproof jacket may be worn over the club shirt on colder or wet days. Sew on club badges are available if desired.
- At roll-ups players are encouraged to wear the approved kit but may also wear blue or grey trousers or shorts and a white or predominantly white shirt. Jeans, bright or multicoloured trousers, shorts or shirts do not meet the expected dress code generally expected in the sport and players are respectfully requested to comply with the Club's policy.
- At all times without exception any member entering the green must wear flat-soled, heel-less footwear. This can be of any colour.

#### What are my responsibilities?

• Skip - Generally the skip is responsible for directing the team and agreeing with their opponent on any issues which may arise during the game

## Specific duties are:

- To set the jack.
- o To advise their lead, second and third players.
- To keep a record of the score using the scorecard. The Skip may request the team's second or third player to keep score.
- Lead duties are:
  - When starting the game, to lay the mat, deliver the jack and provide advice to the Skip to set the jack on the centreline of the rink.
  - o If losing an end, to gather the bowls following the conclusion of that end.
  - o If winning an end, to assist in gathering the bowls.
  - o To start the next end by laying the mat and delivering the jack.
- Second (in triples) or Third (in fours, or "rinks"), player duties are:
  - o To keep a record of the score using the scoreboard.
  - o To assist the skip from the head during play.
  - To determine the nearest bowl(s) to the jack and where necessary to measure the distance of bowls from the jack.
  - o To agree the score with their opposite number and advise the skip of the agreed score.
  - To assist with gathering the bowls.
